Funding Sources, Information & Programs Supporting Economic Resiliency

FEDERAL RESOURCES

- **SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL)**
 - **Eligibility:** Generally, small businesses and non-profit organizations with fewer than 500 employees. Proceeds can be used to cover working capital and normal operating expenses.

- **SBA Express Bridge Loans**
 - **Eligibility:** Provides access to up to \$1,000,000 quickly and with less paperwork for small businesses who currently have a business relationship with an SBA Express Lender.
 - **How to Apply:** Contact your Express Bridge Loan Lender or connect with the [SBA Colorado District Office](#).
- **Small Business Debt Relief Program**
 - **Eligibility:** Small businesses who currently have an outstanding SBA 7(a) loan, 504 loan or microloan, or take out such a loan by September 27, 2020.
 - Provides immediate relief to small businesses with non-disaster SBA loans. SBA will cover all loan payments, including principal, interest, and fees, for six months.
